New Music In the Key of Sorry

Pat McDougall – CD Release Party (4/18/23)

n The Key Of Sorry is a Collection of 12 star-studded songs written by Pat McDougall, and recorded at Jimi Bott's Roseleaf Recording Studio in SE Portland. Though best known for his work in blues music, this eclectic mix of songs has something for everyone: up-tempo blues, melancholy soul ballads, swampy slide guitar blues, ironically humorous romps, even a pop-rock anthem. The project was co-produced by McDougall and Bott. "This album has been great fun to work on. Pat's songs cover the gamut: heartwarming, soulful, at times comical but always thoughtful with intention and meaning. I hope everyone gets as much enjoyment listening to it as we had making it!" adds Bott.

Though the album is currently available for pre-order at bit.ly/keyofsorry, the official celebration will be the CD release party in April. This promises to be a very special event! The party kicks off with Ben Rice & The Hustle - the full horn band - followed by McDougall's band Tall Static performing songs from the



new album and featuring as many guest musicians from the project as is possible to get together in one place at one time: Lloyd Jones, Alan Hager, Ben Rice, Kivett Bednar and Joe McCarthy, with more special guest artists in the works. Says Lloyd Jones, "when I heard his songwriting, I was delighted to join in the fun among such monsters gathered!" Are we sensing a theme here?

Pre-orders help cover the costs of completing the project. Those ordering the CD will receive a signed copy shipped on the release date as well as a digital download of the album made available that same day. What is really cool are the additional incentive packages for different contribution amounts, including access to the exclusive release party at Catfish Lou's on April 22nd. There are multiple price points available for attending this event, depending on whether you'd like to include a meal, a signed CD, a T-shirt, baseball cap, or a kickass coffee mug.

Any and all support from the public – whether pre-ordering a CD, buying a head-turning T-shirt, or hiring Tall Static for a private event – is hugely appreciated and will help ease the financial burden of this project. But even just telling your friends about the pre-order opportunity and sharing the link is a big help.

Performers on the disc include Pat McDougall's bandmates in Tall Static - Ed Pierce, Whit Draper and Jim Solberg – as well as featured appearances by Kid Andersen, Kivett Bednar, Jimi Bott, John Bunzow, Kara Grainger, Alan Hager, Jerry Jemmott (bassist with Aretha Franklin, B.B. King, many others), Lloyd Jones, Lisa Mann, Ben Rice, Doug Rowell, Kevin Selfe, LaRhonda Steele and more. All songs were written by Pat McDougall except one co-written with Grammy winner Peter Boe, former keyboardist with Robert Cray and Curtis Salgado.

About Pat McDougall

Pat has performed with a long list of bands and artists, including his own blues/R&B outfits Runaway Train and Tall Static. He was the musical director for the Portland-based band supporting Tony Coleman (B.B. King's drummer for many years), and a member of the Muddy Award-winning lineup of Bill Rhoades & The Party Kings.

Most recently, Pat was the keyboardist and musical director for the Rae Gordon Band, helping to create their acclaimed and award-winning CDs Better Than I Was and Wrong Kind Of Love, including writing and co-writing 18 of the songs ("The songs on Wrong Kind Of Love rock, roll and grind with an elemental passion and lust that cannot be ignored." - John Kereiff) and coordinating the band's appearances at venues and festivals throughout the Pacific Northwest and beyond.

These days Pat can be heard playing with his own band Tall Static, as well as Ben Rice & The Hustle, Fenix Rising, Joanne Broh, Lisa Mann and others. Pat has composed music for commercials, independent films, theatrical productions and corporate presentations; his compositions have won recognition from the Portland Music Association and Keyboard magazine.

Our musical community was stunned at the news of Doug Rowell's passing in January. Numerous videos, posts, photos and other tributes poured out on Facebook from fellow musicians, longtime fans and anyone else who knew and loved Doug.

I last chatted with him in mid-November to confirm he'd be a part of Marlena Masterson's benefit later that month. Little did I know at the time that he was fighting off the cancer that finally took his life.

His simple response completely illustrates the type of man Doug was: "Helping each other is what we're supposed to do."

Here is just a small sampling of the tributes shared online:

Kevin Selfe: "Your music and spirit will live on in all of us. I love you brother."

Chance Hayden (his successor in Vintage Soul): "He was the

sweetest, most gentle soul and a real bad boy on the guitar."

Pat McDougall added this reminder: "Given what a generous and loving human Doug was, one way to remember him is to practice those qualities with others:

- Reach out a hand to those who can use it
- Live your life before you lose it."

Kelly Ralph: I'll close by quoting photographer Kelly Ralph (who shared so many excellent photos of Doug over the years): "There is an old adage that says that we die 3 times: firstly, when your body dies; secondly, when the last person who knew you dies; and thirdly, when your name is spoken for the last time."

From Memphis to Portland:

International Blues Challenge and Upcoming Tours

his never-bored Board Member recently returned from the International Blues Challenge (IBC) in Memphis at the end of January after spending a whirlwind week trying to catch as many performances as humanly possible. The madness starts on Tuesday with several International Showcases presenting the 'best of the best' from many other countries, while most of our Northwest contingent cruised down to the Hambone Gallery in Clarksdale Mississippi for a Welcome Jam that included the CBA's representatives TJ Wong Trio and Andrew Mathews, along with CBA President Rae Gordon and other merry music makers.

Wednesday and Thursday start off with several showcases in the afternoon along a two-block stretch of Beale Street, while the competition happens between 5pm and 11ish, followed by various after hours jams. Other than making sure we were at Wet Willie's when TJ Wong Trio performed both nights, it just wasn't possible to take in every band and every solo/duo act as they perform both nights at one of 13 separate venues each running 20-25 minute sets concurrently. TJ Wong gave it their all both nights and had the crowd dancing and cheering.

Though the trio didn't advance to the semi-finals, the real value for anyone attending the IBC is in making new connections and discovering other musical acts. Consider that every affiliate is sending



their best to Memphis – that's like a kid in a candy store to a blues fan! (By the way, there IS a candy store right there on Beale Street that makes the most intriguing fudge flavors) And when you find out that some of these incredibly talented blues acts are coming to Portland, you want to make sure to get the word out about how incredibly jaw-droppingly GOOD they are!

So here goes:

Shakura S'Aida wasn't a competitor, but appeared in showcases and at the after hours jams. JAW DROP-PING INCREDIBLE. And she'll be playing in Portland at Alberta Abbey on April 7th with (The Real) Lady A. Sonny Hess and Lady Kat will be supporting them. *Tickets on sale now!*

 BMA winner Nick Schnebelen, also featured in showcases on Beale St, is expected to be slinging his guitar at Catfish Lou's on April 23rd with a Special Guest. *Tickets on sale soon*! • Also spotted on stage at the IBC; actor, guitarist, keyboardist, accordion player, singer, and songwriter Tyron Benoit will be coming to Portland in May. Details in the next issue.

RIP Tom Addis & Thad Beckman

Tom Addis

On Friday, Jan. 6, 2023, Tom Addis passed away in his home in Portland surrounded by family. Tom, 68, was a man of many loves. Family, friends, laughter, The Oregon Ducks, and music. Especially the blues. Tom spent more than two decades as a DJ for KMHD/OPB, where he was host of the "Blues Palace" program.

His time spent sharing his love of the blues with listeners in Portland brought him years of joy and he's remembered fondly by many in the blues community. He introduced many listeners to blues music, and brought together scores of local and touring musicians. Tom was truly a community builder (adapted from the Oregonian).

Thad Beckman (August 21, 1952 -January 16, 2023)

They say you die twice. One time when you stop breathing and a second time, a bit later on, when somebody says your name for the last time. ~ Banksy

This doesn't apply to Thad Beckman; he'll live on through his music long after all who knew him have taken their final breaths. Due to COVID and health issues, Thad hadn't performed live for several years before his final performance at Artichoke Music last August. Thad was on oxygen for part of the show but that didn't stop

him from playing and singing beautifully. The audience responded with respect for the music and love for the man. Both he and his music touched the hearts of people in the USA and abroad. His music survives him and that is a blessing.

Thad had an engaging personality and told true stories that made one laugh. Or cry. Audiences became part of the magic he created. John T. Davis of the Austin American Statesman describes Thad as having "A voice that rasps like shoe leather on roadside gravel, and a finger-picked guitar on which notes fly by like railroad ties under a fast moving freight."

Thad performed in clubs and theaters, on radio and television. He played around the world and recorded over seven

CDs of original material and blues standards. He played with various Blues and Rhythm-and-Blues bands including Bo Diddley and Earl Thomas. He opened for B.B. King, Albert Collins, The Band, Emmy Lou Harris, Dan Hicks, James Cotton and many other artists. He played guitar tracks on numerous projects including the award-winning 2007 documentary "Eloquent Nude, The Love and Legacy of Edward Weston and Charis Wilson," directed by Ian McCluskey.
